We- the Ratepayers of the Village of Mundare assembled at the Annual meeting, Jan. 25th, 1946, strongly condemn the action of the Minister of Public Works in refusing to gravel the spur of Highway No. 16, one and one-half mile of road leading into Mundare, while the Department was then working in and out of Mundare in graveling Highway No. 16 in the year 1945.

Therefore we strongly request our Provincial Department of Public Works to take immediate steps to gravel this spur as soon as the weather will permit.

That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Minister of Public Works, Alberta, and to the M.L.A. Mr. M. Pannich.

Motion was put to a vote. Carried.

Motion was seconded by Mr. Ignatius Hawryluk. Motion carried.



Mr. M. Novakowski requested that the owners of cows in the Village be forewarned to take better care of their cows in not letting them roam about the Village over the sidewalks and into people's gardens during the summer time.

Mr. John Sachkiw requested that the Council endeavor to rid the Village of ownerless dogs. Also that better policing of the Village be undertaken.

M. Novakowski adjourned the meeting by moving a vote of thanks to the Council for their good work in the past year.

Meeting of the Council held at the Town Hall at 8.30 p.m. Councillors J. Sachkiw, and J. Swekla, and Mayor Mr. A.B. Lesnik were present.

The minutes of the meeting of Apr. 2nd was read. John Sachkiw moved and J. Swekla seconded the adoption of the minutes as read.

Mr. Wm. Hrynyk saw Council in regards a walk. Council decided that a walk be built out of old material and to extend from his gate eastward to the corner of the block.

The Pres. Of The Chamber of Commerce, Mundare, Mr. A.E. Niewchess saw the Council in regards a temporary loan of \$200.00 to be repaid before the end of the year. He also requested that the Ball Park west of Blk. 15, be fenced in. The Council decided that the Ball Park be fenced in.

It was moved by Mr. John Swekla, and seconded by John Sachkiw that the Village of Mundare make a loan of \$200.00 to the Chamber of Commerce of Mundare, and that the said loan be repaid within the current year. Motion carried.

Mr. R. Nimmon, of Gas & Oil Products Ltd., Edmonton, saw the Council in regards an approval to have a Gas and Oils warehouse built on the location of Lots 15, & 16, Block 9, and that gasoline storage tanks of 15000 gal. capacity to be underground, on the same location.

The Council decided that this matter be taken up with the Chamber of Commerce at its next meeting. The Sec. was also instructed to write to Gas & Oil Products Ltd., Edmonton, proposing that the Co. share in the costs of building a culvert in the drain ditch next to their garage lot 21, Blk. 5. as this was in the interests of the Company as well as that of the Village.

Mrs. Annie Yusak saw Council in regards fee to be charged for pound keeping. Council agreed that Mrs. Yusak have the authority to charge \$.75 per head kept by her in the pound up to five hours.

Mr. Mike Osinchuk saw Council requesting that some kind of walk be made up to his home in Blk. 36.

Mrs. Joe Bandura saw Council re assessment on her barn recently damaged by fire. Mrs. Bandura was asked to present her case before the Court of Revision.

Mr. Wm. Zaozirny saw the Council re its approval of a License to carry on a business of butcher shop, etc. in the Village. Council asked Mr. Zaozirny to make his application on the proper form to the Dept. of Trade & Industry, and then the Council would consider it.

Mr. S. Yuzda saw the Council in regards material, and the building of walks (cement) in the Village. Mr. Yuzda was asked to present his tender for the cost of building a 5 ft. cement walk from lots 1, to 9, along the eastern side of blk. Nine.

The Council approved Mr. W.P. Stawniczy's application for a Retail Trade License.

Mr. A.B. Lesnik moved and J. Sachkiw seconded that the arrears of taxes on Lots 4, & 6, in blk. 10, Plan No. 610 V in the amount of \$8.40 on each lot be cancelled on account of the reason that the tax of \$8.00 levied in 1945, on the said land should not have been levied by the Mundare S.D.
