 There are two new charges \$1.00 sewer reserves and \$1.00 Water reserves. Approximately \$4.45 increase per month for an average residential user.
 Bulk water will go up \$0.05 a cubic meter at the truck fill station.

Pickleball is a paddleball sport, like racquetball, that combines elements of tennis, badminton, ping-pong and table tennis. Two or four players use solid paddles to hit a perforated polymer ball, like a Wiffle Ball, over a net. It's played inside or outdoors on a badminton-sized court with a slightly modified tennis net. This sport has been gaining popularity as it is accessible for people of all ages and skill levels.

RURAL MENTAL HEALTH PROJECT

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Alberta has a training (+funding) opportunity specifically for rural communities (i.e any town outside of the 7-urban centers). **The Rural Mental Health Project (RMHP)** can provide training and funding to each community, plus connections with other rural communities, local and provincial stakeholders who are working to support rural mental health.

The RMHP aims to strengthen community capacity for better mental health in rural and remote communities. The Project focuses on building local capacity in up to 150 rural communities in Alberta by training Animators living in those communities. The Animator is a local community member who is interested in catalyzing that conversation in the community. Animators can connect

with other stakeholders through the Rural Mental health Network– a hub to work collectively, learn from others and gain/share access to resources, funding, and more.

Training and funding are provided to Animators to cover their time and travel. Funds are routed through a local community back bone organization, who can help identify Animators' in their community.

If you (or others) are interested in taking part in the project, please contact rmh@cmbha.sb.ca and someone from the team will guide you through the following tasks;

1. Expression of interest– you can choose your preferences for starting dates so that we can best coordinate our training sessions with Animators, subsequently we will follow up with you

2. Have an Animator ready to go? Complete the Onboarding Form– It gives us the details to confirm and schedule the animator in the next available training session (be sure to complete the Expression of Interest, as well)

3. Sign up for the Rural Mental Health Newsletter– Provides quarterly updates on the project and Network activities and growth.

4. Register to join the Rural Mental Health Network. A space to learn more, to share resources, events, experiences, and more!

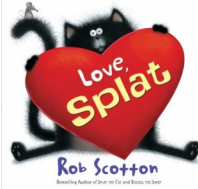
