The Mundare Municipal Public Library is following the guidelines provided by the Public Library Service Branch, Municipal Affairs:

Use of self-service checkout and return services as much as possible.

Encourage the public to use distanced options for borrowing materials-promoting e-books and other virtual resources and services.

Offering curbside pickup and drop off.

Browsing library catalogues online at home and using 'holds' to reserve materials.

Reduce the amount of time patrons spend in the library.

As new information becomes available updates will be posted on the front door of the Mundare Town Office building and on the bulletin boards near the library entrance.

Library will be OPEN to one patron at a time (masks and gloves required):

Tuesdays and Thursdays 10am to 4pm.
