Tabletop pickup of items ordered using TRAC or the library website is available Monday to Friday during the Town of Mundare office hours.

Starting on Tuesday, September 21, the Mundare Library Board chose to follow capacity and operating restrictions as outlined on the Government of Alberta website:

1. Library capacity is restricted to 2 individuals plus the Library Manager (1/3 fire code occupancy).
2. Attendees must be with household members only, or 2 close contacts if living alone.

Masks and 2 metre physical distancing is required.

As always, the library manager is on hand to help patrons order items from TRAC and/or the Mundare library or website and to renew library cards. Items can be returned using the book return near the library door.

2025 is a powerful tool in helping libraries meet the needs of the communities they serve. It is also a legal requirement for public libraries in Alberta.
